DESPITE + RZECZOWNIK (rzecz)

- Trains are still running, despite the snow.
- The pop festival passed off peacefully, despite the fears of local residents.
- The overall situation is good, despite a few minor problems.
- He was able to lead a normal life, despite the illness.
- She manages to stay cheerful despite everything.

DESPITE + CZASOWNIK+ING

Despite being hungry, I want to finish my project.
Despite falling down, she won the race.

DESPITE + the fact that

Despite the fact that I'm hungry, I want to finish my project.
Despite the fact that she fell down, she won the race.
